A reminder that all Life Skills teaching takes place in a safe learning environment and is underpinned by our school ethos and values of love, humility, compassion, courage, hope and thankfulness.

The sessions are taught by our form tutors or delivered by expert speakers, such as <u>ACET UK</u>, who plan and deliver our talks on Relationships and Sex Education (RSE). RSE is an essential aspect of the physical, moral, and emotional development that all young people need to be safe in an everchanging world.

There is no right to withdraw children from the relationships education lessons, and we believe the content of these lessons are important for all children to be taught. You do have a right to withdraw your child from sex education delivered as part of RSE in secondary schools which, unless there are exceptional circumstances, will be granted up to three terms before your child turns 16. At this point, if the child themselves wishes to receive sex education rather than be withdrawn, the school will make arrangements for this to happen in one of the three terms before the child turns 16 - the legal age of sexual consent.
